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#### THE POTTERY FROM A AND C-GROUP TOMBS AT SERRA WEST IN THE MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY, LA PLATA\*

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## Summary: The Pottery from A and C-Group Tombs at Serra West in the Museum of Natural History, La Plata

The Museum of Natural History, La Plata, Argentina, houses a ceramic collection of the A-Group and C-Group cultures from Nubian tombs at Serra West (AA and ACS cemeteries), on the west bank of the Nile in Lower Nubia. It has been originated from the division after the excavations made by the Franco-Argentine Archaeological Expedition in Sudan between 1961 and 1963, as part of the UNESCO campaigns to save the Nubian monuments.

Keywords: Lower Nubia - Serra West - A-Group pottery - C-Group pottery

#### Resumen: La cerámica de las tumbas de los Grupos A y C de Serra Oeste en el Museo de Ciencias Naturales, La Plata

El Museo de Ciencias Naturales de La Plata, Argentina, posee una colección de piezas cerámicas provenientes de las tumbas nubias de Serra Oeste (cementerios AA y ACS), sobre la margen izquierda del Nilo, en la Baja Nubia, que pertenecen a las culturas de los Grupos A y C. Esta colección es producto del reparto realizado después de las excavaciones de la Expedición Franco-Argentina en Sudán entre 1961 y 1963, como parte de las campañas de la UNESCO para salvar los monumentos de Nubia.

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#### **I.** INTRODUCTION

The Museum of Natural History in La Plata,<sup>1</sup> Argentina, houses a collection of reliefs and inscriptions as well as few ceramics from the Ramesside settlement of Aksha, the funerary equipment from some A, C,<sup>2</sup> Meroitic and X-Group tombs from Serra West, and most of the ceramics from a 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty tomb at Beidir.<sup>3</sup> This collection has been originated from the division after the excavations made by the Franco-Argentine Archaeological Expedition in the district of Serra West, Republic of Sudan (Fig. 1), between 1961 and 1963, under the co-direction of Jean Vercoutter (France) and Abraham Rosenvasser (Argentina), as part of the UNESCO campaigns to save the Nubian monuments. Serra West was located in Lower Nubia on the west bank of the Nile, to the north of the Second Cataract and south of Faras West.

Besides the Ramesside settlement of Aksha, the following sites were excavated<sup>4</sup> inside a polygonal area of ca. 12,5 km<sup>2</sup> (Fig. 2):<sup>5</sup> - **AB**, a temporary C-Group settlement, **AC**, a small C-Group cemetery, and **AM**, a small Meroitic cemetery, all of them in the northern part of the concession around the village of Aksha;<sup>6</sup> - **AXS**, a Meroitic and X-Group cemetery<sup>7</sup> in the northern part of the village of Serra West; - **AA**<sub>1-4</sub>, a group of four very small A-Group cemeteries,<sup>8</sup> - **ACS**,<sup>9</sup> an A and C-Group cemetery, and **MSA**, a Meroitic and X-Group cemetery,<sup>10</sup> both in the southern part of the concession, i.e. in the southern part of the village of Serra West; - **P1 to P9**, Prehistoric sites.

The pottery from the A-Group tombs housed in the Museum comes from two cemeteries at Serra West, AA and ACS (Fig. 2). It has been mainly dated as Late or Terminal A-Group (ca. 3300-3000 BC), contemporary to the very beginning of the 1<sup>st</sup> Dynasty in Egypt. That from the C-Group tombs was recovered from the site ACS, which belongs to the Phases Ia and Ib, i.e. from

the 1<sup>st</sup> Intermediate Period to the beginning of the Middle Kingdom in Egypt (ca. 2160-1930 BC).<sup>11</sup>

For the study of the pottery I adopted the classification of wares and types, and the chronology used by Hans-Åke Nordström<sup>12</sup> for the archaeological material from Serra East and other sites in the Sudanese Nubia, excavated by the Scandinavian Joint Expedition; for the fabrics the "Vienna System", when there is an equivalent.<sup>13</sup> For the chronology of the C-Group pottery, I used the phases established by Manfred Bietak.<sup>14</sup> A complete description of the pottery is presented in the **Catalogue**.<sup>15</sup>

#### **II. THE A-GROUP**

#### Introduction

Our knowledge from the A-Group culture, as well as the C-Group, mainly comes from tombs, which funerary assemblages included pottery, personal adornments, toilet utensils and tools.

The **A-Group** people settled in Lower Nubia during the 4<sup>th</sup> Millennium BC, contemporary to Nagada I-III in Upper Egypt (3800-3000 BC), i.e. from the Egyptian Predynastic period to the beginning of the Pharaonic state, when we have no more information about this culture.<sup>16</sup> They practiced agriculture in the Nile valley between the First and Second Cataract, breed cattle in the surrounding deserts,<sup>17</sup> and brought exotic products from Sub-Saharan Africa

to Egypt. Their settlements and tombs were located in strategic areas in connection with these trade routes. The contacts between Upper Egypt and Nubia in the late Predynastic period show the interest of the Nagadians in African prestige goods, such as gold, ivory, incense, ebony, exotic animal skins. At the same time, Nagada culture products, such as wine jars, cooper tools, stone vessels and faience, are found in A-Group sites of Lower Nubia.

According to the chronology of the Egyptian pottery found in A-Group contexts, the *Early A-Group* is dated to Nagada Ic-IIa (ca. 3700-3500 BC), and the *Late* or *Terminal A-Group* to Nagada IIc-IIIb (ca. 3300-3000 BC).<sup>18</sup> The Egyptian military activity in Lower Nubia during the Late Predynastic Period, i.e. the Dynasty "0", destroyed the A-Group trade and consequently produced the declining of the ruling elite, as it is shown by the disappearing of imports in Lower Nubia and by the end of the cemetery L at Qustul.<sup>19</sup>

#### Commentary on the A-Group Pottery Collection

The Museum has 68 vessels from the AA and ACS cemeteries, from which 56 are Nubian (82 %) and 12 imported (18 %; Graph 1). Most of them (61 vessels) come from the site ACS, being 51 Nubian and 10 Egyptian; from the site AA, 5 are Nubian and 2 imported.<sup>20</sup>

#### 1. The Nubian Pottery

The *Early Nubian* pottery is hand-made. The open shapes were formed with the paddle-and-anvil shaping technique; the closed vessels were made in sections and then joint at the neck. On the techniques there is a vessel worth mentioning: **No. 4** (Fig. 3), a **cup**, free modelling with the fingers, the simplest and earliest method used for modelling. The texture is uncompacted and smooth, with some marks of scraping, a thumb-mark on the base and finger-prints on the rim.

The *shapes* are cups (14 vessels; 25 %), bowls (33; 59 %), jars (8; 14 %), and a strainer (Graph 3). They are mostly rounded-bottomed (30; 54 %), some have dimpled bases (9; 16 %), flattened (7; 12 %) or pointed (3; 5 %); one base is knob-shaped (2 %; Graph 12).

The fabric most used is Nile  $B_1$  (44 vessels; 79 %), Nile silt clay tempered with dung, because the A-Group people were cattle herders. Other fabrics are Nile D, "Nile  $B_1$  type", tempered with limestone particles and some straw (6 vessels; 11 %); Nile C, a coarse fabric with chaff inclusion (4 vessels; 7 %), and an ash-tempered Nile silt clay fabric classified by Nordström as II A (2 vessels, 3 %; Graph 10), with no equivalence in the "Vienna System".

The most used *wares* are *Brown-and-black*, *burnished* (21 vessels; 38 %), then *Smooth*, *brown* (18; 32 %), and finally *Brown burnished* (17; 30 %; Graph 4). In the group of *Smooth*, *brown wares*, 12 vessels are *uncoated brown smoothed* (67 %), 2 *scraped* (11 %), and 4 *red-coated* (22 %; Graph 5). The *Brown burnished wares* include 4 vessels (23 %) of *uncoated*, *plain*, *burnished brown ware*, 10 (59 %) of *red-burnished ware*, 2 (12 %) of *ripple*, *red ware*, and a vessel of *red-burnished ware with uncompacted interior* (6 %; Graph 6). In the group of *Brown-and-black*, *burnished wares*, 5 vessels (24 %) are *plain*, *burnished*, *brown-and-black ware*, 9 (43 %) *coated*, *plain*, *burnished*, *red-and-black ware* (Graph 7).

The exterior surface treatment is burnished (50 %), smoothed (30 %), rippled (16 %) or scraped (4 %; Graph 13). Most of the pottery is plain (77 %), but some vessels with very thin side-walls ("egg-shell" ware; **Nos. 21, 36 to 41**; Figs. 4-6; 12 %; Graph 14)<sup>21</sup> have a red-painted decoration, and then, when the surface was leather-hard, it was skilled smooth to get a low to high lustre burnishing. From a technical point of view this ware is the finest of the A-Group pottery.<sup>22</sup> Others have a vertical ripple-burnished surface (**Nos. 51-56**; Fig. 7; 11 %),<sup>23</sup> which is achieved by combing the vessel before burnishing. These rippled ceramics present also a decoration on the rim top (milled rim): an impressed pattern of oblique, parallel, closed lines, or zigzag lines, except a jar (**No. 56**, Fig. 7) with a plain rim (Graph 14).<sup>24</sup>

#### 2. The Imported Pottery

The imported pottery (12 vessels) comes from two regions, Egypt (10 vessels, 83 %) and the Eastern Sahara (2 vessels, 17 %; Graph 2).

All the *Egyptian ceramics* (Nos. 57-66) were found in tombs from the site ACS. They are mainly made of Marl  $A_1$ , a limestone-tempered fabric, and of a hard, pink or grey ware of Egyptian Predynastic tradition (9 vessels, 90 %).

This fabric is characterized as a homogeneous groundmass, with irregular pores produced by the burning of the limestone particles added as temper and a light-red core. Only one is made of Nile silt clay, in Nile C fabric, i.e. chaff-tempered (10 %; Graph 9).<sup>25</sup> The shapes are mainly jars (8; 80 %), and only 2 are bowls (20 %; Graph 8).

The Egyptian pottery is also hand-made. The closed vessels were shaped in sections and then joint at the neck, which was added in a turning device that forms a regular rim and leaves throwing lines on it.<sup>26</sup> A jar<sup>27</sup> was coilmade, whose junctures are tactually preserved.<sup>28</sup> The bases are round. The open shapes were made with the paddle-and-anvil shaping technique. The surface treatment is smoothed, burnished or scraped. Some of the vessels are decorated.

No. 59 (Fig. 8), a slender jar, and No. 61 (Fig. 8), a medium-broad jar with an incised potmark on the body, were vertically smoothed with an instrument. No. 62 (Fig. 8), a medium-broad jar, has the surface vertically scraped, and was decorated with an incised potmark and red-painted wave-lines. No. 66 (Fig. 8), also a medium-broad jar, presents an incised geometric potmark on the shoulder made on the surface burnished with low lustre. No. 65 (Fig. 8) is a medium-sized bowl with clearly distinct burnish marks running radial inside from the rim towards the base, and horizontal outside. No. 58 (Fig. 7), a medium-sized, deep bowl, has both surface smoothed. A crack, developed radial from the rim downwards, has been repaired with a string as two repair holes show.

These jars and bowls employed as containers were imported from Upper Egypt, because of the marl clay utilized for shaping. The jars were used to transport wine to Nubia,<sup>29</sup> and then locally reused for storage.<sup>30</sup>

**No. 57** (Fig. 7) is a Nile clay **large jar** with a very short neck, an ovoid body and a flattened base, classified as "rough ware", i.e. chaff-tempered coarse ware (Nile C), and coil-made, whose junctures are tactually preserved. The texture is uncompacted and coarse.

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The Egyptian pottery is dated to the very beginning of the 1<sup>st</sup> Dynasty.

*Eastern Sahara imports.* Nos. 67 and 68 (Fig. 8) are the so-called "Clayton rings",<sup>31</sup> a ring open at both ends. These are made of unbaked clay, sun dried, tempered with chaff and sand. No perforated disks, usually found together with the rings, are in the Museum. These objects come from the same cemetery (AA) and tomb (No. II), as come the two rings and their disks housed now in Lille.<sup>32</sup>

"Clayton rings", which function and use are unknown, have been discovered in both sides of the Nile valley, in the Western and Eastern deserts of Egypt: in the first one, in large number in many sites of the Eastern Sahara region, from Wadi Shaw in the south to Farafra Oasis in the north, and in the second desert, in Wadi Umm Sidrah.<sup>33</sup> They are predominantly found in short-term transitory camps in the desert around the Late Predynastic or Early Dynastic period, ca. 3200-3100 BC,<sup>34</sup> probably made by the indigenous population from the oasis.<sup>35</sup>

#### 3. Specific Characteristics of the A-Group Pottery Collection in the Museum

Some characteristics of the Nubian and imported pottery from the A-Group tombs, which are not found in the large amount of ceramics recovered by the Scandinavian excavations, or present variations in the type group, in the combination of shape and ware, in the shape or in the decoration, are mentioned below.

#### A) The A-Group Pottery

The **dish No. 21** (Fig. 4) has a decoration inside: a *red-painted "feather"pattern design* applied on the light brown uncoated surface, and is plain redpainted outside. Both surfaces were burnished with medium lustre. It is unknown in the Scandinavian Collection, although dishes painted inside were found in the funerary equipment of the tombs at Qustul.<sup>36</sup>

Decorative patterns were painted, instead of incised, on the exterior surface of some vessels. An inverted-triangle pattern, filled with parallel lines, was

red-painted on the upper part of the **bowl No. 36** (Fig. 5), while the lower part was full painted. Basket-work patterns were red-painted on two **bowls**, **No. 37** (Fig. 5), and **No. 40** (Fig. 6), this with the decoration applied on the upper part of the vessel and the lower part full painted. A red-painted herring-bone pattern was applied on the **deep bowl No. 39** (Fig. 6), and a red-painted criss-cross lines pattern decorates a **cup** (**No. 41**, Fig. 6) made of red-and-black burnished ware. A complex red-painted design, which combines criss-cross lines, inverted triangles -filled with red paint- and a herring-bone pattern, is found on the **bowl No. 38** (Fig. 5).

Some vessels present *variations or differences in the type group*. Two **jars** were made with rounded bases: **No. 9** (Fig. 3) with a very short neck and ovoid body, and **No. 13** (Fig. 3) with an oval body, restricted shape, and scraped surface. A third one, **No. 14** (Fig. 4), has a modelled, everted rim - instead of a direct rim. The **shallow bowl** with an unrestricted shape, **No. 54** (Fig. 7), has a knob-shaped base, a variant to the Type Group AXb1 with a rounded base. **No. 20** (Fig. 4), a **deep bowl** with a pointed lower body, restricted shape and pointed base, has the exterior plain burnished instead of decorated, such as in the Type Group AIa16.

No. 12 (Fig. 3), a large jar with a pointed lower body and short neck, a restricted, necked vessel shape (RNI.3), rounded-bottomed with a slight knob, made of Nile D ("Nile  $B_1$  type"), is designated with a new number, *Type Group Alg4*.

A *different combination of shape and ware* is represented in some vessels, and therefore classified as new type groups. **No. 8** (Fig. 3) is a **deep bowl** with a rounded lower body, the restricted shape 5, and uncoated ware with both surfaces brown smoothed. **No. 19** (Fig. 4) is a **cup** with a pointed lower body, the restricted shape RS.4, a pointed base, brown burnished ware and black-topped. The **cup No. 16** (Fig. 4), with an oval body and a broad variant of the restricted shape RS.2, was made of red-coated smoothed brown ware, instead of brown-and-black burnished ware as in the SJE Corpus.

The **deep bowl No. 33** (Fig. 5), with a pointed lower body and pointed base, was modelled with the restricted shape 4, and ripped on a red coating outside and brown burnished inside. The **shallow bowl No. 34** (Fig. 5), with a rounded body and the unrestricted shape 18, was ripped on the red coating outside and brown burnished inside. The **bowl No. 45** (Fig. 6), with a slightly pointed lower body and rounded base, has the restricted shape 11 and was made of burnished red-and-black ware.

**No. 50**, a **bowl** (Fig. 7) with a nearly hemispheric body, modelled in the unrestricted shape 5, and **No. 51** (Fig. 7), a black-mouthed **bowl** with a pointed

body, the unrestricted shape 10 and a dimpled base, were made of ripple, redand-black burnished ware and black-mouthed.

#### B) The Imported Pottery

The **round-bottomed bottle No. 64** (Fig. 8) is *a variant*\* of the Type Group AXIn1. It was made of Marl A<sub>1</sub>, with the surface burnished with low lustre. It preserves the turning marks on the neck. Two **jars** have incised potmarks, such as *a sandal-print* (**No. 60**, Fig. 8) and *a panther* (**No. 63**, Fig. 8). The last one is decorated also with an incised geometric potmark on the lip and dark red-painted wavy-lines. These potmarks have been already represented in rock drawings but not in the vessels. These three vessels are Egyptian imports.

No Eastern Sahara "Clayton rings" were found in the Scandinavian excavations.

#### 4. Conclusions

The pottery from the A-Group tombs mainly belongs to the Late or Terminal Period, which is contemporary to the very beginning of the 1<sup>st</sup> Dynasty in Egypt (20 tombs; 47 %). Four tombs (9 %) are dated to the Classic period, i.e. in the time of Nagada III; one (2 %) can be from the Classic or the Late period, and sixteen tombs (37 %) have pottery that is common to all the periods. In two of the tombs no pottery has been found to date it, only a find in each one (Graph 15). This collection adds some new features to the A-Group pottery from Lower Nubia, particularly to the SJE Corpus.

#### III. THE C-GROUP

#### Introduction

The **C-Group** people appeared in Lower Nubia around 2300 BC, and continued there until 1500 BC, i.e. from the late Old Kingdom to the early New Kingdom in Egypt. The first settlers probably entered in Lower Nubia from the south. The culture is closely related, if not identical, to the earliest phase of the Kerma culture settled about the same time southern of the Third Cataract, because *Early C-Group* material is already found there.<sup>37</sup> As the A-Group people, at the

beginning they were mainly pastoralist, herders of cattle, sheep and goats; later they practiced also agriculture and developed larger tribal organisations headed by powerful chieftains.<sup>38</sup> The most important settlements, such as Faras, Qustul, Aniba and Dakka, definitely indicate a sedentary life.

Bietak<sup>39</sup> established five chronological phases or periods of this culture based on the characteristic of the tombs and the pottery. The first two phases, Ia and Ib, are dated to a span of time from the 1<sup>st</sup> Intermediate Period to the early Middle Kingdom.<sup>40</sup> The phase IIa is contemporary to the 12<sup>th</sup> Dynasty, when the Egyptians occupied Lower Nubia around 2000 BC and dominated the areas of the C-Group people by fortresses located in strategic places along the Second Cataract. The fourth phase, IIb, is dated to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Intermediate Period, when the Kingdom of Kerma unified Nubia; the large communities of the C-Group must have disappeared, and only small cemeteries are found in this phase. Phase III is the last stage, parallel to the 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty; in the late part of this phase, a mix of cultures, Egyptian, Pan Grave and Kerma, occupied Lower Nubia.<sup>41</sup>

#### Commentary on the C-Group Pottery Collection

The C-Group pottery collection is very small. It comes from the site ACS (Fig. 2), and consists of 21 Nubian vessels (95 %) and an Egyptian one (5 %; Graph 16). The pottery that is characteristic of this culture is represented in the collection: black incised (BI), red incised (RI) and red-burnished black-topped bowls.<sup>42</sup>

#### 1. The Nubian Pottery

The *Middle Nubian* pottery is hand-made. All the vessels were made of Nile  $B_1$  fabric. The *shapes* are mostly bowls (18 vessels; 90 %), only two are jars (10 %; Graph 17). The vessels are quite fragmentary: no more than two pots are complete; some are fragments with the section complete or partially reconstructed, or rim sherds; and others are body sherds from bowls or jars. The most used wares are *Brown-and-black burnished* (9 vessels; 45 %), then

*Burnished, black-incised* (6; 30 %), and finally *Smoothed, uncoated brown* (4; 20 %). Only a vessel (5 %) was made of *Burnished, red-incised ware* (Graph 18). Most of them are decorated.

The only complete, plain pots are a jar and a bowl. The **jar**, **No. 71** (Fig. 9), has a rounded body, restricted, necked shape with an inflected contour, modelled rim and round base, a maximum diameter of 15 cm and a height of 16 cm. The exterior is smoothed with a black-topped rim, and the interior combed. The **bowl**, **No. 83** (Fig. 10), has a rounded body, restricted shape with a simple, continuous contour, direct rim and rounded base. It is 16.5 cm of maximum diameter and 9.5 cm high. The red-coated exterior and the black interior were burnished. This bowl and the body sherd of another (**No. 84**, Fig. 10) are the only ceramics of *Red-and-black burnished*, *black-topped ware* in the Museum.

Three sherds have an **incised decoration** made on the *uncoated, smooth brown* surface. One of them is from the rim of a **large bowl** (**No. 70**, Fig. 9), decorated with a pattern of horizontal herring-bone whole-lines, similar to the SJE collection No. 9 from the site 370 at Abka. The design was made with a pointed instrument which leaves slightly raised edges on both sides of the incised trough. The others are the body sherds from a **bowl** (**No. 69**, Fig. 9) with a radial design structure and a pattern of parallel vertical lines, and from a **jar** (**No. 72**, Fig. 9) with two horizontal lines and a pattern of oblique parallel lines.

Three bowls have a **red-impressed** decoration. **No. 80** (Fig. 10) is a fragment of a **large bowl** with a pointed body, made of *burnished red-coated and black ware, black-mouthed*. The design has a radial structure and a pattern of vertical parallel dotted-lines made with a rocker-stamp, which covers the exterior from the base to the rim. Similar decoration is found on the rim sherd **No. 81** (Fig. 10) from a **bowl**, and on the body sherd **No. 82** (Fig. 10) from another one. The design corresponds to No. 12 of the Phase Ia in Bietak classification, who dated this phase as *Early C-Group*, contemporary to the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Dynasties.

Other three bowls have a **black-incised** decoration. **No. 74** (Fig. 9) is the rim and body fragment from a **bowl** with a rounded body and direct rim. The exterior surface has a decoration, with traces of white filling, of a quadrilateral design structure, a pattern of plain and incised woven bands and an incised rim-band, which corresponds to Ib 4 in Bietak classification. The surface was burnished outside and combed inside. **Nos. 75** and **76** (Fig. 9) are body sherds from two **bowls** with the same design: a pattern of plain and incised concentric lozenges, Ib 5 in Bietak classification.

A sherd has a **black impressed-incised** decoration. It is **No.** 77 (Fig. 9), the rim and body fragment of a **bowl**, decorated with an incised zigzag band beneath the rim, a burnished band between the rim and the body, and an incised pattern of burnished snakes on the impressed hatched background on the body. Similar design could have had another **bowl**, from which only a sherd with the impressed hatched surface was recovered **No.** 79, (Fig. 9). The decoration corresponds to Ib 8 in Bietak classification. The surface of all these black-incised bowls was burnished outside and scraped inside, i.e. made of *black, burnished, incised ware with uncompacted interior*.

Others **bowls** (Nos. 73, 85-88) were made of *burnished ware, with brown or black uncompacted interior*, and different **red-incised** designs.

A quadrilateral design structure with a pattern of incised chevrons, plain and with parallel lines, which corresponds to Ib 7 in Bietak classification, is found on the **bowls No. 73** (Fig. 9) and **No. 85** (Fig. 10). The first one, a shallow bowl of unrestricted shape, direct rim, broad flat base, and combed brown interior, 16 cm of rim and 4.8 cm high, has an incised rim-band. The second one, a rim sherd with a combed black interior, has an impressed zigzag pattern on the black-mouthed rim-band. A pattern of plain and incised concentric lozenges decorates the body sherd **No. 86** (Fig. 10) from a **bowl**; and a pattern of plain and incised woven bands the body sherds **Nos. 87** and **88** (Fig. 10) also from bowls. The first pattern corresponds to Ib 5 in Bietak classification, and the second one to Ib 4. All of them have a combed black interior.

The Phase Ib is dated as *Middle C-Group*, contemporary to the late 11<sup>th</sup> and early 12<sup>th</sup> Dynasties in Egypt.

#### 2. The Imported Pottery

An imported vessel, the only Egyptian from the C-Group tombs at the Museum, is **No. 89** (Fig. 10), a complete **jar** with a globular body, restricted, necked with an inflected contour, an everted direct rim and a round base which was flattened. The vessel was modelled in a slow wheel because of the throwing lines preserved inside; the body was smoothed by hand, as the finger-marks show, and the rim finished on the wheel, slightly pinched with the fingers. It was made of Nile silt clay tempered with dung (Nile B<sub>1</sub>), and of red-coated ware. It is similar to the jar Nr. E.2541 from Beni Hasan, now in the Ashmolean Museum,<sup>43</sup> dated to the beginning of the Middle Kingdom.

#### 3. Conclusions

The pottery from the C-Group tombs of the ACS cemetery mainly belongs to the Phase Ib in Bietak classification, that is to say to the *Middle C-Group*, contemporary to the late 11<sup>th</sup> and early 12<sup>th</sup> Dynasties in Egypt, ca. 2025-1930 BC (Graphs 20 and 21). **No. 84**, a red-coated burnished sherd that was found in the same tomb (No. CXXXVII) than the sherds **Nos. 87** and **88**, can be dated to the Phase Ib. Three bowls (**Nos. 80-82**) are earlier, from Phase Ia, i.e. from the *Early C-Group*, parallel to the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Dynasties in Egypt, ca. 2150-2025 BC (Graph 20). Others (**Nos. 69-72**, and **83**) can only be classified as C-Group. Although the Egyptian pottery is very frequent in the Phase Ib, only one vessel (**No. 89**) was recovered. It is dated to the beginning of the Middle Kingdom.

This collection adds no new characteristics to the C-Group pottery of Lower Nubia.














Graph 18: Pottery of Nubian tradition by ware group




**Graph 20: C-Group pottery by chronological phase**
